

Sometimes Ninety Per Cent of the Material Is Foreign Substance.

This is especially the case as

But in much of the fabric sold at the present day there is not more than 10 or 12 per cent of real silk, all the rest being extraneous matter applied to the fiber in the deceptive process of "weighting."

Pure silk, when burned, leaves a quantity of ash which is always considerably less than 1 per cent, but the ash left by some weighted silks has been found to amount to as much as 48 per cent of the weight of the fabric.

The extraneous substances to which we have alluded are caused to adhere to the fiber by passing the skeins through desperate. The beautiful woman by his hot baths of tannin extracts, tin salts, side vainly strove to tear him away.
