

MILLIONS NOW READY.

The United States Senate Wednesday passed the emergency appropriation bill placing at the disposal of the President \$50,000,000 for national defense.

Queen Victoria has sent a message to President McKinley through Ambassador Pauncefote, expressing her gratification at the conservative course which he has pursued in regard to Spain and Cuba.

War in the near future is not considered likely by Americans and other foreign residents in Cuba. It is pointed out that Spain is in a bad position to begin hostilities.

The cruiser Montgomery arrived in Havana harbor and anchored close to the Vizcaya. Captain Converse, her commander, says he has no idea how long his vessel will remain there.

The United States naval Court of Inquiry at Havana spent another day investigating the work of divers. The time of its departure from Havana is still uncertain.

Senor Polo y Bernabe, successor of Senor Dupuy de Lome as Spanish minister at Washington, arrived in New York on his way to his new post of duty.

The Spanish transport steamer Alfonso XII sailed from Barcelona for Cuba, with four officers, 900 soldiers and 4,000,000 cartridges.

Commander W. H. Brownson sailed from New York to visit European shipyards, with a view of buying vessels for the United States Navy.

Shipbuilders are working day and night at Newport News, where the battle ships Illinois, Kearsage and Kentucky are being built. Their hurry is said to be the outcome of instructions from Washington.

The revenue cutter Windom is said to be laying torpedoes in the vicinity of Fort Monroe and the other defenses at the entrance to Chesapeake bay.

The Navy Department at Washington is considering a proposition to strengthen the Asiatic squadron and to attach the battle ship Oregon to Commodore Dewey's effective fighting force.

Orders have been issued for the immediate commissioning of the twin cruisers Minneapolis and Columbia. These vessels may form the nucleus of the prospective flying squadron.

Pittsburg school children are to pioneer a monument for the sailors of the Maine who are buried in Havana. Pennies are to be contributed by every scholar.

YELLOW FEVER GERM.

CHICAGO, March 6.—Dr. Edwin Klebs, professor of pathology and bacteriology in the Postgraduate Medical School, claims to have discovered the cause of yellow fever.

Professor Klebs made his experiments on the stomach, duodenum and liver of two patients who had died of fever in Mobile.
