The committee has decided unanimously to make a report to the Senate, declaring that Mr. Clark is not entitled to the seat he now holds.

Big Power-House at Austin Tumbles Into the River—Heavy Losses to Crops. AUSTIN, TEX., April 8.—The increased volume of water which came down the river last night undermined the powerhouse at the dam 1.30 o'clock this morning.

The rivers are now falling. The railroads have lost many bridges, and it will be a week before traffic resumes its normal condition.

Smithville reports tremendous rains have fallen throughout that section, the main flood in the Colorado from the break in the great Austin dam reaching there this evening.

The country tributary to the Colorado River, all the way down its course, is being inundated, and while it is believed the worst is over the loss as estimated tonight will exceed some three million dollars.
