A Story of Farragut in Command When but Twelve Years of Age.

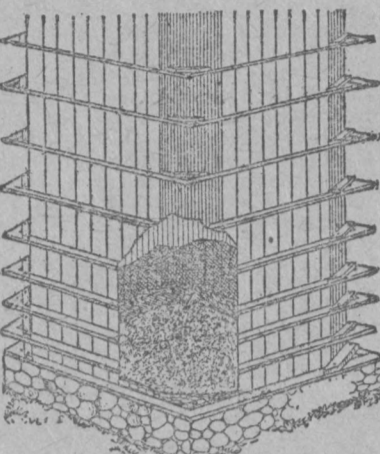

FARM GARDEN

A PRACTICAL SILO.

Cheap, Strong and Tight—It Can Be Readily Built Anywhere.

The picture shows a silo that anybody can build who has the lumber. It is economical, strong and tight. I have three of this kind and speak where I know, says Edward Van Alstyne in American Agriculturist.

A second thickness of siding should be put on to break joints. Do not use paper between the boards, as it will rot out. I have a silo built of single boards of six inch matched pine.

ANCIENT FISH CURES

MEDICINAL VIRTUES THAT USED TO DECK THE FINNY TRIBE.

Perch Was Valued in Germany For Its Curative Properties, and Carps Was Held in High Esteem in Old England—The Physician of Fishes.

Fishing literature prior to the days and writings of Isaac Walton opens up points of interest which are unique. Not the least interesting are the constant references of the early writers to the medicinal virtues of fish.
