Chief Justice Will Be Mount **Graduation Speaker**



Earl Warren, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, will deliver the commencement address at the 159th Commencement Exercises to be held at Mount Saint Mary's College, on Wednesday, June 7, at 10:30 The Colonial Color Guard

Chief Justice Warren, a native of California, will receive an honorary doctor of laws degree from the college for his long years of public service. He has been Chief Justice since 1953 and prior to that served as Governor of Cali-fornia from 1943-1953. Other oficos which he has held included that of Attorney General of California, District Attorney for Alameda County, and Deputy City Attorney for Oakland. He also has held minor posts and served with distinction in World War I.

Warren has been honored by several other colleges and universities including his alma mater, the University of California, from which he received an honorary
