Now that the din and smoke of the verbal battle of the coming election is at its zenith, it is the time to ferret out the facts and make up your mind as to the candidates you will finally vote for next Tuesday. Issues are hardly at stake and are not very soundly discussed. Name-calling and mud slinging has been reverted to and it's now up to you to wade through the mud and smoke screen and pick a candidate. Almost every candidate's financial status has been forcefully elicited and his life thoroughly scrutinized. We advise you to study it. The questions are at the top and are in very short and simple language so you shouldn't have any problem familiarizing yourself with them before Tuesday's election.

This year the sponsoring organization, the American Legion, has just about doubled the prize money and it should provide a greater interest among the contestants. Mr. Lalley is president and chief executive officer of Peterson, Howell & Heather, Inc. He has been with the Baltimore concern since 1952. He is also currently serving as a director of the Baltimore Life Insurance Co. The newest addition to the Mount's Board of Trustees is active in the field of education. He has served on the Board of Trustees of Mount Saint Agnes College of Baltimore and the University of Baltimore and he is on the Board of Directors of the Association of Independent Colleges of Maryland.

Mr. Lalley has found time in his busy schedule to participate in many civic activities. He is presently vice president of the Community Chest of the Baltimore area. He has served on the Board of Directors of the Health & Welfare Council of Baltimore and he is a former chairman of the Agency Services Committee of the Community Chest.

Professor's Book Brings Recognition

Thomas Reeves' new book "The End of the Draft," has only been out three weeks, and already the new political science professor at Mount Saint Mary's College is something of a celebrity.

Within the past two weeks, Mr. Reeves has appeared on the NBC Today show, the Arlene Francis talk show in New York City and the Don Gordon talk show in Detroit. Within the next month he will appear on The John Madigan Show, a panel program that is seen throughout the Midwest, and a talk show that is produced by WBRC-TV in Boston.

In addition to his television appearances, Mr. Reeves will be the center of attention at several press luncheons. Sessions are to be held in New York, Detroit (Nov. 1), Boston (Nov. 15), and Chicago (Nov. 22). Mr. Reeves appeared before twenty-two prominent Washington editors and correspondents on October 7.

"The End of the Draft," Reeves' first book, calls conscription a violation of individual freedom and proposes as its replacement a volunteer army. The book was co-authored by Karl Hess and includes prefaces by Senators Geo. McGovern and Mark O. Hatfield. Reeves comes to the Mount after teaching for several years at American University in Washington. He has received degrees from Birmingham-Southern College, American University, Harvard University, and Humboldt in Berlin, Germany. He taught for several years in West Germany.

Mr. Reeves is an ordained Methodist minister and he has served several parishes in Alabama and Massachusetts. He is donating his royalties from the book to the American Friends Service Committee, Inc.

Concert to Feature Beethoven Works

Ludwig van Beethoven lovers arise! On November 7 at St. Joseph College all Beethoven fans will be able to celebrate his 200th birthday. The concert, featuring the fourth movement of Beethoven's Ninth, or "Choral" Symphony, will be held in DePaul auditorium at 8 p.m.

The Glee Club and Wind Ensemble of Manhattan College, a men's college in New York City, both under the direction of Dr. Antonio Lizaso, will join the St. Joseph College Chorale and the Emmitsburg Community Chorus in the jubilee. Guest soloist from New York City will sing the demanding solo parts.

The concert has been arranged by Sister Jane Marie Perrot, director of music at St. Joseph's and conductor of the Community Chorus, in cooperation with Dr. Lizaso. Dr. Allen Bonde, chairman of the music department at Hood College, will accompany the Chorale.

St. Joseph College Chorale will perform selections which include Bach works in the style of the Swingle Singers, a group of Spanish Ballades, and compositions by Vaclav Nelyhyel and Michael Bilenko. The Manhattan College Orchestra will play two movements of the Beethoven Fifth Symphony.

Admission is free and the public is welcome to attend the bicentennial celebration.

Plan Exhibition Of Composer's Works

From November 2 to 23, St. Joseph College will host an exhibition of rare first editions of Beethoven master-works. The display of Beethoven scores marks the third in a series of events commemorating the bicentennial anniversary of the composer's birth. The exhibit is sponsored by the Broadcast Music, Inc. of New York, which has an extensive collection of Beethoven works in its Archives Collection.

St. Joseph is one of eight colleges and universities to receive the exhibit, and will be the only college in the Maryland-Pennsylvania area to house it for the 1970-71 school year.

Scores in the collection on display will include the Leonore Overture No. 1, the Mass in C Major, op. 86, Piano Sonatas, Nos. 5, 22, 23, 27; Sonata No. 9 for Violin and Piano and Symphonies Nos. 3 ("Eroica"), 5, and 6 ("Pastorale").

Admission is free and the public is welcome to view the scores which will be displayed on the 3rd floor of Brute Hall. Some of the scores are available to college professors and music teachers for actual study on the premises of the college. Mrs. Ralph L. Holland, Austin, Texas, will be the guest speaker on Sunday morning, Nov. 1, at Incarnation United Church of Christ. She will speak at the 10:45 a.m. Worship Service at the Emmitsburg church as well as at St. James Church R1, Littlestown, Pa., located on the Harney Road, at the 9 a.m. Worship Hour.

Mrs. Holland and her husband, Dr. Ralph L. Holland, are Mission Interpreters and United Church of Christ ecumenical leaders who have studied first-hand by visiting and observing many of the denominational and interdenominational mission enterprises in Japan, Korea, Taiwan, The Philippines, Hong Kong, India, Iraq, Turkey and Greece. They are particularly concerned with ecumenical work in these countries.

The Hollands served as two of the 12 delegates from the U. S. to the 70-delegate study conference on "Peace Through International Economic Justice" held in Geneva in 1967. They have visited 20 of the 40 conferences of the United Church of Christ helping churches to understand the excellent work being accomplished by their "Our Christian World Mission" dollars overseas which is carried on by the Board for World Ministries. They also explain the work of the other instrumentalities which are maintained by the Board of Homeland Ministries whose basic support is likewise provided through the OCMW dollars of all the local congregations of the United Church of Christ.

Mrs. Holland is an alumna of Chatham College and has been active for many years in a variety of denominational and ecumenical organizations. For eight years she was national chairman of Christian Citizenship and a member of the Board of Directors of the Women's Guild of the Evangelical and Reformed Church. She has also served on the Social Action Commission of her denomination.

Mrs. Holland is currently vice president of the Board for Homeland Ministries of the United Church of Christ, and has been a member of that board since 1963. She is also a member of the Stewardship Council of the United Church of Christ. From 1962-65 she was vice president of the Massachusetts Council of Churches and also president of the Massachusetts Council of Church Women. She was a member of the board of managers of Church Women from 1952-55, and from 1955-58 was field councillor for Church Women United in 13 Northeastern states.

Not only members of Incarnation Church, but all other persons interested in innovative modes of Christian Witness being used in the present day church, are cordially invited to either, or both, of the services of the Incarnation-St. James Charge on Sunday morning. Rev. John C. Chatlos is the pastor of the charge.

Library Receives New Book Supply

New books are being written all the time about the only earth we have. Green plants, animals, fresh air and water are so familiar that man takes them for granted. The time has come when we can no longer be an unconcerned people. In fact, if man is not careful, he may destroy the only environment in which he can survive. For the younger patron a book entitled "The only earth we have," by Laurence Pringle, will enable the young person to see and to give new meaning to his life by helping to preserve our country. He clearly explains what is happening and why. He shows how pesticides become concentrated enough to kill wildlife; how air is made dangerous to breathe; how water becomes polluted and unusable; how the disposal of used material has grown to be a major problem; how ponds and lakes and the life they support may disappear entirely. This book discusses the dangers to mankind if earth's resources continue to be plundered and describes what can be done to preserve and protect the only earth we have.

For the adult patron who is interested in ecology and conservation, "A Different Kind of Country," by Raymond F. Dasmann. Mr. Dasmann concerns himself with the human environment - what we are doing to it, and what we must do to keep it fit for people to live in. The book ranges from cities to the values of wilderness, undisturbed lands, natural communities. Various programs are outlined, including a demonstration islands program in which experts would put their various skills to work in selected island areas around the world, where results would be apparent in a relatively short time.

The "Sense of Wonder," by Rachel Carson, can be read by any age. It is especially illustrated with nature scenes in color. It is especially dedicated to the author's nephew Roger, who was about twenty months old when she wrapped him in a blanket and carried him down to a beach in the rainy darkness. "If a child is to keep alive his inborn sense of wonder," Miss Carson writes, "he needs the companionship of at least one adult who can share it, rediscovering with him the joy, excitement and mystery of the world we live in." Her narrative and the photographs that accompany it chart the paths which adult and child can take together on this journey of discovery.

SOCIAL SECURITY NEWS

Q. After I began receiving social security benefits, I returned to work. Will this additional work increase my benefit?

A. The law provides for an automatic annual refiguring of benefits to determine if a beneficiary's earnings after retirement will increase his benefit. If an increase results, the benefit increase will be automatic. You need not take any action of your own.

Q. What affect is there in my social security benefit if I take it at age 62 rather than waiting until age 65?

A. Your social security benefit, if taken prior to age 65, is reduced by 5/9 of 1% for each month before age 65. At age 62 the benefit reduction is 20%.

Q. I am permitted to earn any amount for the year in which I am age 72. Is that correct?

A. You are permitted to earn any amount beginning the month of the year in which you are 72. Any months of the year in which you are under 72 are still subject to the annual earnings test of \$1,680.00. For more information on the annual earnings test, contact your nearest social security office.

Q. I am thinking of retiring but find it very difficult to call at the social security office during their office hours. Can this matter be handled any other way?

A. Yes. Telephone the office at your convenience. Your retirement application will be completed over the telephone and then mailed to you for your signature. Any required proofs can also be returned to the office by mail along with the signed application.

Q. I began receiving my social security benefit at age 62. Is it true that my benefit will be increased when I become 65?

A. No. Your benefit will not be increased when you reach 65. When you filed at age 62, your benefit was permanently reduced. The only exception to this rule is those cases where a beneficiary did not receive a check before age 65 due to working. At age 65, cases are refigured to take into account those months for which no checks were received. In these cases only will an increase result.

Q. I keep reading and hearing that a person should contact his social security office two to three months before he plans to retire. Why is this important?

A. By contacting the office two to three months before retirement, we can start the wheels turning. We can obtain the necessary application and any necessary proofs. We can then process your claim so that when your first retirement check is due it will be on time.

Q. My husband and I receive a combined social security check; however, we would prefer separate checks. Is this possible?

A. Issuing combined social security checks saves the Government a considerable amount of money. However, if for personal reasons, separate checks are desired then separate checks can be issued. Contact your social security office and tell them you wish separate checks.

ORDER OF PUBLICATION

THIS IS TO GIVE NOTICE that on the 22nd day of September, 1970, a Petition of Condemnation was filed in the Circuit Court for Frederick County against certain Defendants all of whom are residents of the State of Maryland, and Julius Ginsburg and Gertrude S. Ginsburg, his wife, whose address is Van Ness Apartments, N., 3001 Veazy Terrace, N.W., Washington, D. C. 20008. The object of the Petition is to condemn in fee simple a parcel of land located in the Seventh Election District of Frederick County, State of Maryland, and the right to trim, cut down, and remove trees on adjacent parcels of land which will be more particularly hereinafter described; that the said land is to be used for the construction, operation, and maintenance of electric transmission lines and appurtenant equipment, in, under, over, and across said parcel of fee simple land. The Petitioner recites:

1. That the Plaintiff is authorized by law to acquire by purchase or condemnation, any property or right necessary in connection with the construction of electric lines to be used in supplying the public with electric light and power.

2. Fox and John Fox, Trustees and Joseph J. Oleinik and Johanna Marie Oleinik, Beneficiaries.

2. That the Plaintiff may have such other and further relief as the nature of its case may require.

WHEREUPON, it is ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County this 22nd day of September, 1970, that the Plaintiff caused to be personally served upon the non-resident Defendants Julius Ginsburg and Gertrude S. Ginsburg a copy of this Order of Publication and a copy of the Petition of Condemnation on or before the 31st day of October, 1970, notifying the said Defendants to be and appear in this Honorable Court in proper person or by attorney on or before the 1st day of December, 1970, to show cause, if any he may have, why the relief prayed should not be granted.

OFFICE OF THE CLERK OF THE COURT
The position of Clerk is one of the oldest in Maryland; It was created by the State Constitution in 1650. It is a State Office and the Clerk, who must be bonded, is responsible to the State Comptroller. The Clerk's office performs a wide variety of administrative duties which help keep the court system operating in orderly fashion.

DEEDS
One of the most important responsibilities of this office, is the accurate preservation of the DEEDS, MORTGAGES and other LEGAL INSTRUMENTS relating to your homes and properties.

OTHER DUTIES
Among the duties of the staff are: to receive and file suits, maintain dockets of the various courts, assign civil cases for trial, record verdicts and judgments of the Courts and issue the writs, or orders of the Court.

LICENSES
In addition, the Clerk's office issues marriage, traders' and liquor licenses, among others. And, as of January 1, 1964, the General Assembly granted the Clerk permission to perform civil marriages.

CHIEF DEPUTY CLERK (First Appointment)
On February 17, 1936, following a ten year period during which I served in every possible capacity in the office, I was named Chief Deputy Clerk. Within the year I was appointed Clerk by the Judges of the Sixth Judicial Circuit to succeed the late Eli G. Haugh (my predecessor), who died while in office. The oath as Clerk of the Court was administered to me November 27, 1936.
