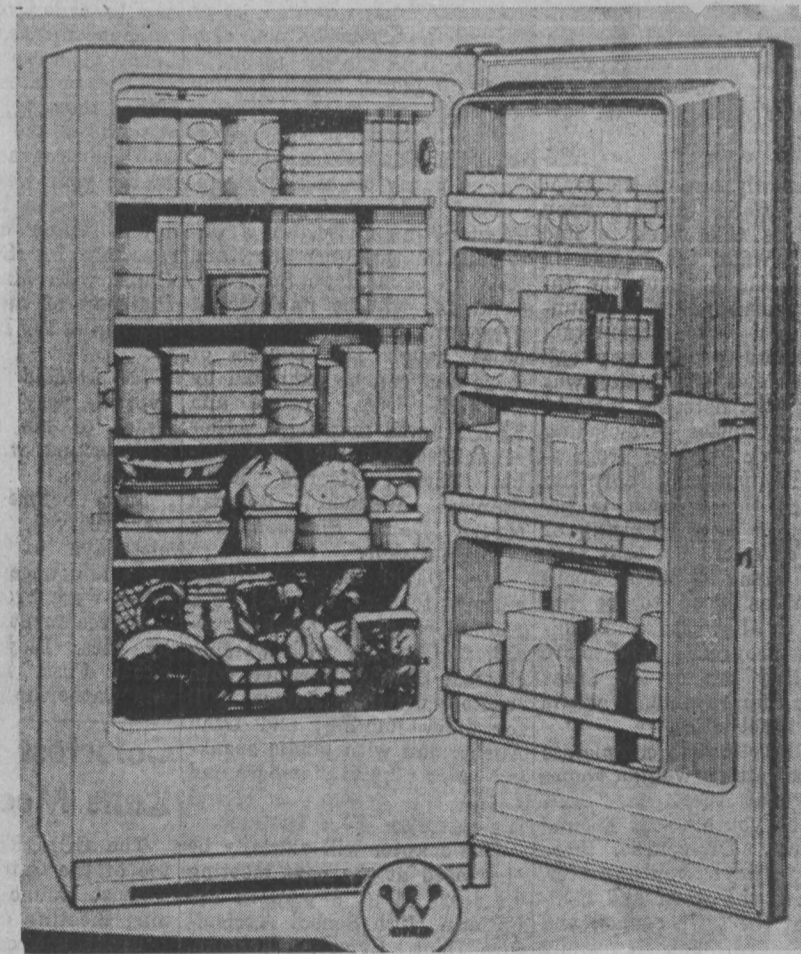

Lunch Programs May Be In Trouble

School lunch programs in Maryland will suffer a serious blow on June 30 unless the U. S. Department of Agriculture changes its mind about its commodity donation program.

Presently, the Department distributes over \$300 million each year in commodities — meats, fruit, vegetables, flour, butter and other foods. It wants to substitute cash —

the same prices USDA can, and

Schools equipped to utilize commodity foods in food preparation would require extensive equipment alteration.

Processing of federal commodities has yielded big dividends to local school systems. Bread made with Federal flour, shipped directly to the bakery from the Department, costs schools only about 25 cents a loaf. Mayonnaise made with Federal oil costs about a third of the price the housewife pays in the supermarket.

et. Similar savings can be realized in processing spaghetti, pizza, crackers, cookies, and cake mixes from donated commodities.

All school systems in Maryland benefit from the commodity processing, with biggest savings being registered last year in Baltimore City (\$108,000), Baltimore County (\$55,400), and Prince George's County (\$53,000).

Kenneth Shifflett, state specialist in commodity distribution, says that processing of commodities on a statewide basis can almost double their value. Last year, he says, the state saved over \$415,000. That three year old project, he said, could be expanded to yield even greater savings. Last year Maryland schools utilized five million pounds of flour more than the preceding year.

If these raw materials are not made available by the Department, all our processing experience and savings to recipient agencies will be lost, he says.

Besides the commodities suitable for processing, the schools receive other Federal commodities, such as canned vegetables, fruits, frozen ground beef and frankfurters, that go directly to schools. Total value of all commodities received by Maryland schools last year was \$4.5 million. The entire food allocation would be replaced by the seven-cents-per-lunch plan of the Department of Agriculture.

"With the loss of commodity donations," Shifflett said, "there is no possible way we can buy the same products locally at prices the government pays when it buys in large quantities."

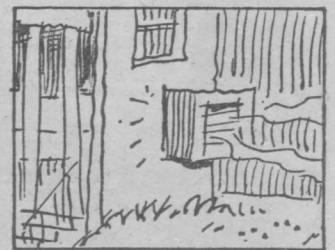
