Selecting Eggs for Hatching.

Chickens from pullets' eggs have been hatched successfully and if a trifle smaller than the others at first, have been lively and strong and grow so rapidly as soon to be as large as any in the flock. In most instances eggs from pullets or fowls less than a year old have seemed to produce chickens that were quite as vigorous and thrifty as those from older hens, and mating young fowls with a two-year old cock has been considered the best method by many practical poultrymen.

April work on the lawn. With April's coming we may usually begin work in earnest among the flowers and shrubbery on the lawn. The hyacinths and tulips, jonquils and narcissus will be pushing up their flower stems, and before the month is gone will be delighting us with their flowers.

Cowpeas in Connecticut. Cowpeas have been grown by the Storrs station for the past seven years with satisfactory results. Professor C. S. Phelps reports that, where the crop has been grown on warm soils with a liberal quantity of mineral fertilizer, yields of from eight to ten tons have been obtained.

Orchard Grass With Clover. Orchard grass goes with clover much better than timothy, though most farmers have got in the habit of seeding timothy and clover together. The orchard grass will not make a perfect soil if sown alone, as its habit is to grow in bunches and spread after the first year.

Plant Food For Vegetables. For the early vegetables use your composted manure. It will give quicker results than unfermented manure. Many gardeners claim that nitrate of soda, in which is available nitrogen always ready for use, is enough better and quicker to more than pay its increased cost. It gives the plants an early start, and when applied with stable manure it greatly hastens its decomposition.
