EXPERIMENTS WITH LIME.

Results at the Agricultural Experiment Station.

The many questions that we have received in regard to putting on small quantities of lime on land...

Just before planting corn in the spring of 1898, these plots were treated to lime in quantities ranging from 10 bushels of lime on plot No. 1...

In the summer of 1898 the grass was cut from the above plots, and made into hay, each plot being carefully weighed by itself with the following results:

10 bushels of lime per acre gave a yield of 23.9 bushels of corn per acre... 20 bushels of lime per acre gave a yield of 29.8 bushels of corn per acre...
