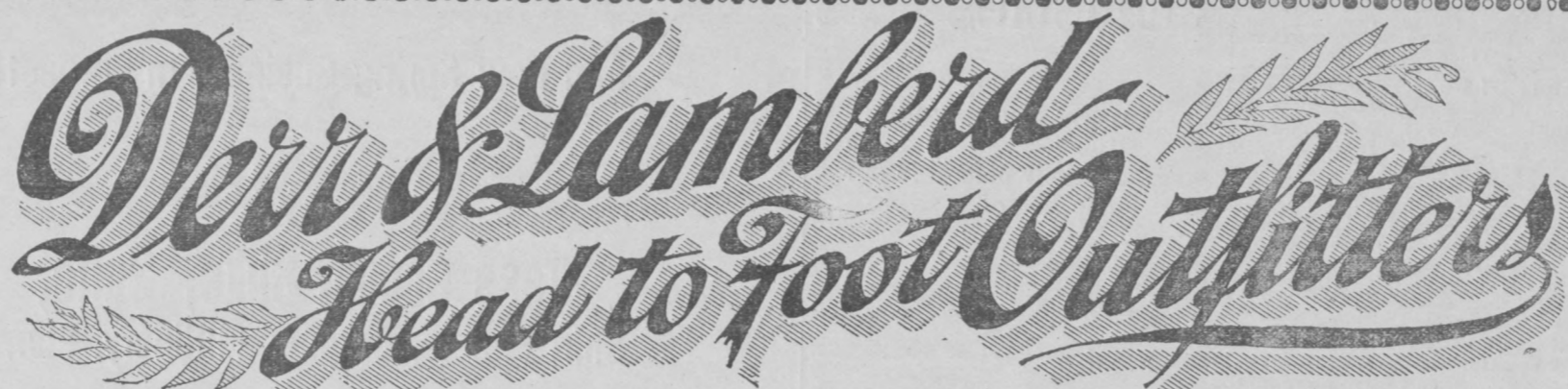

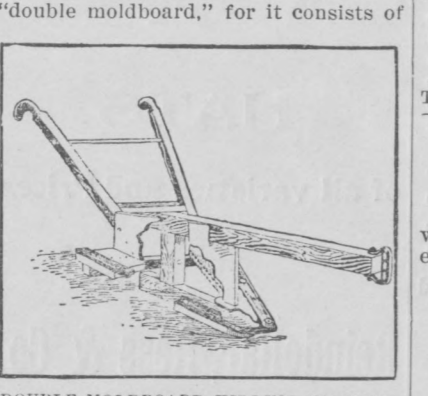

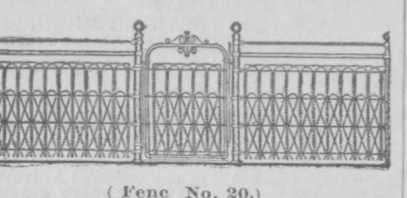


DOUBLE MOLDERBOARD HILLING UP PLOW. A V shaped central portion formed of two vertical sections and a marginal flange of a blunt V shape.
