GRASS ROOTS OPINION

SEATTLE, WASH., REPUBLICAN CALL: "If we consider all civil spending outside of the defense area since 1954 we come up with some startling and shocking figures. In 1954 such expenditures were budgeted at \$12 billion. In fiscal 1963 these costs will have risen to \$26 billion, an increase of 126 per cent. These civil expenditures include agriculture, veterans, health and welfare, commerce, natural resources, space research and technology, education, labor and housing. But this total excludes government trust funds, social security, highway, unemployment compensation and railroad and federal retirement programs. If these were to be included in the 1963 budget the grand total would come to \$52.4 billion."

WINSLOW, ARIZ., MAIL: "There was a time when forests were devastated by loggers and lumbering companies, greedy to get the last dollar from this growing wealth. Now the picture is much different. Only certain mature trees are taken for lumber and almost everything but the bark is being used for one beneficial use or another. . . . It is heartening that among other advances made in our scientific age, nature's wood products are now being utilized to such a great extent."

HARTFORD, WIS., TIMES-PRESS: "Following the fanfare of signing the bill that will shake us down for \$600 million more in postage, and a billion more for Federal pay increases, President Kennedy ordered his bureau chiefs to hold down hiring, fire 'marginal workers' and 'increase employee productivity.' The nation will await these reforms eagerly; but not, we hope, with bated breath."

LENNOX, S.D., INDEPENDENT: "It is illegal to read the Bible in the public schools of Illinois, but a law requires that state to provide a Bible for every prison inmate. Moral of the story: Don't worry kids, if you can't read the Bible in school, you will have the opportunity to do so when you get to prison."

REDFIELD, IOWA, REVIEW-SENTINEL: "Do you know how much less income (Federal) tax you would be paying, if there were no national debt? If your income tax is \$1,000 in 1963—and there was no interest to pay, the budget would be balanced and you would have to pay only \$898. — Excessive interest payments can break the back of an industry—it can do the same to government, or the individual taxpayer."

EVERETT, WASH., HERALD: "In order to take advantage of womanpower, the nation has been encouraging girls to study science and engineering. There is, however, no flood of the fair sex into these fields. A 513-member freshman class at Case Institute of Technology in Cleveland, one of the leading engineering schools, includes only two girls. But when the girls think about this for a moment, and study the male-female ratio of 511 to 2, they may be inclined to reconsider."

HUMBLE, TEX., ECHO: "President Kennedy made the best move of his almost-three years in office . . . when he declared the quarantine, or blockade, of Cuba. Indecisive as he may have been over Cuba and Berlin in the past, we say three cheers to this one. The best part about it, we feel, is the stipulation that any attack launched from Cuba will be regarded as an attack from the Soviet Union. Maybe the shoe will finally be on the foot that wears it."

Ordinance No. 187

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SUB-SECTION 1, b, OF SECTION II OF ORDINANCE NO. 178 (ENACTED FEBRUARY 2, 1959 AND APPROVED FEBRUARY 16, 1959) AND REENACTING THE SAME, WITH AMENDMENTS, TO INCLUDE OCCUPANTS OF APARTMENTS AND HOUSE TRAILERS WITHIN THE DEFINITION OF "CUSTOMER."

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of Taneytown, Maryland, that Sub-section 1 b of Section II of Ordinance No. 178 be, and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

SECTION II
1. DEFINITIONS

b. The word "Customer" shall mean the user of service receiving water at one household, apartment, house trailer or place of business.

Ordinance No. 188

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RE-ENACT ORDINANCE NO. 166 RELATING TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE PARK BOARD OF TANEYTOWN MEMORIAL PARK AND PERTAINING TO THE USE AND MAINTENANCE THEREOF.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Taneytown, Maryland, that Ordinance No. 166 be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

SECTION 1: Be it enacted by the Mayor and City Council of Taneytown, Maryland, that Taneytown Memorial Park shall be dedicated to those from this community who have served their Country in war.

SECTION 2: Be it further enacted and ordained that Taneytown Memorial Park shall be operated and managed by a Park Board composed of eight (8) members, namely (1) the Mayor, (2) a City Councilman, (3) one member of the Chamber of Commerce, (4) one member of the Junior Chamber of Commerce, (5) one member of the Lion's Club, (6) one member of the Kiwanis Club, (7) one member of the Fire Department and (8) one member of the American Legion. The Mayor shall be a member ex officio and each of the other members shall serve at the will of the body or organization which he may represent.

SECTION 3: Be it further enacted and ordained that it shall be the duty of said Park Board to promote all types of athletics, sports and recreation and to encourage the use of Taneytown Memorial Park for wholesome community purposes. Said Park Board shall be authorized to raise and promote funds by subscription or by other lawful means, shall expend such funds for improvement of and equipment for Taneytown Memorial Park, and shall authorize and permit any club or organization to improve or equip said Park, or any portion thereof, within such limits as may be prescribed by said Park Board. Maintenance of said Park shall be and remain the obligation and responsibility of the Mayor and City Council. All actions of said Park Board shall be subject to review by the Mayor and City Council.

SECTION 4: Be it further enacted and ordained that said Park Board shall submit to the Mayor and City Council an annual report of the financial transactions and standing of said Board as of the fiscal year ending June 30 of each and every year, said reports to be submitted no later than July 15 following such year.

SECTION 5: Be it further enacted and ordained that this ordinance shall be effective from and after the day and date of its passage.

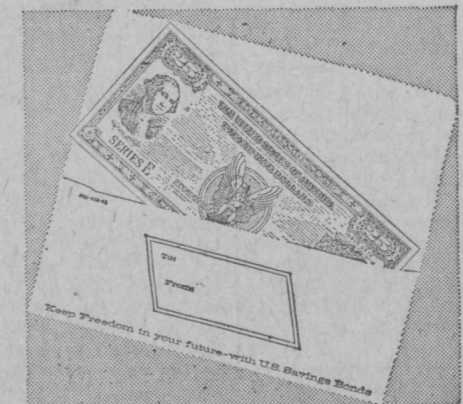

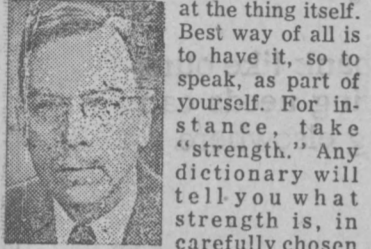
International Union Sundry School Lessons

New Kind of Love

Lesson for December 16, 1962

THERE are three ways of knowing what a thing is. First is by looking the word up in the dictionary, or to have some one tell us about it. Second comes the knowing which comes by looking at the thing itself.



Best way of all is to have it, so to speak, as part of yourself. For instance, take "strength." Any dictionary will tell you what strength is, in carefully chosen words. You could then tell someone else what strength means, only your telling would be just a matter of remembering the right words. A better way would be harder to forget. Suppose you nearly drowned at a bathing beach, and a lifeguard rescued you. Then you would know what strength is, and you would always remember it, even if you forgot what the dictionary said. But the best way of all is to grow strong yourself. Then even if you lost your memory entirely, you would know what strength is.

"Is your heart true to my heart?" All this is specially true of the much-talked-about thing called, in our language, Love. The Bible has much to say about it. But let no reader of the Bible think that because he has read about it, even on these inspired pages, he now knows love. Every writer of the Bible would agree that to know love truly, we have to be loved, and to love. Nevertheless, the words the Bible writers use are not unimportant. They give us a clue to how we may recognize love, genuine love, from imitations. The Apostle John gives us a rather horrible example of what hate is; and expects us to understand that love is its opposite. Love is NOT like what Cain the murderer felt for his brother Abel. Why did he murder him? John

because his own deeds were evil and his brother's righteous—in other words, because he was bad and his brother good. Hatred comes from lack of unity, love comes from unity of spirit. Saint John is fond of explaining a thing by naming its opposite. Love, we have seen, is the opposite of hate. It is also the opposite of death. Most people would say off-hand that the opposite of death is life. John would warn that life without love is death. Not to love means remaining in death. And yet, love may lead to death, literally, and it must lead (or be marked counterfeit) to devotion of life. How would you like to be shut up for hours on end, day after day, with subnormal children who can hardly even talk, cannot hold a pencil, cannot play or move like normal children? Most of us would think that a perfectly horrible existence; but there is a little lady some seventy years of age, who does just that . . . because she loves children life that. And if you think, well, that's an old lady, she can do this, but a young woman, no—if you think that, you evidently have not met a young woman this writer remembers, one of the happiest young women he ever met, who finds her happiness in helping these helpless children. There is more than one way to live; down one life.

Not in talk but in truth Saint John is called the Apostle of Love, but he has no exclusive right to that honorable title. No one can read what Paul said in I Corinthians 13 for example, or Peter in I Peter 3:8, 9, or our Lord Himself in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5), to mention only a few of the places rewarding careful study) without seeing that all agree on this: Love is real when it becomes living acts, something more than a word. In fact, John contrasts love "in word or speech" with love "in deed and truth." As we were saying about strength, so with love. We know it a little from reading or hearing about it. We know it better when some one loves us; we know it best of all not when we become eloquent about it but when what we do every day, the way we habitually move and think and act, the way we live, spells love so plainly no one can miss it. And now if someone complains that this is too high for us, let us freely confess: This kind of love is so rare as to be a new surprise every time we find it. But find it we do; for it is the signature of God.

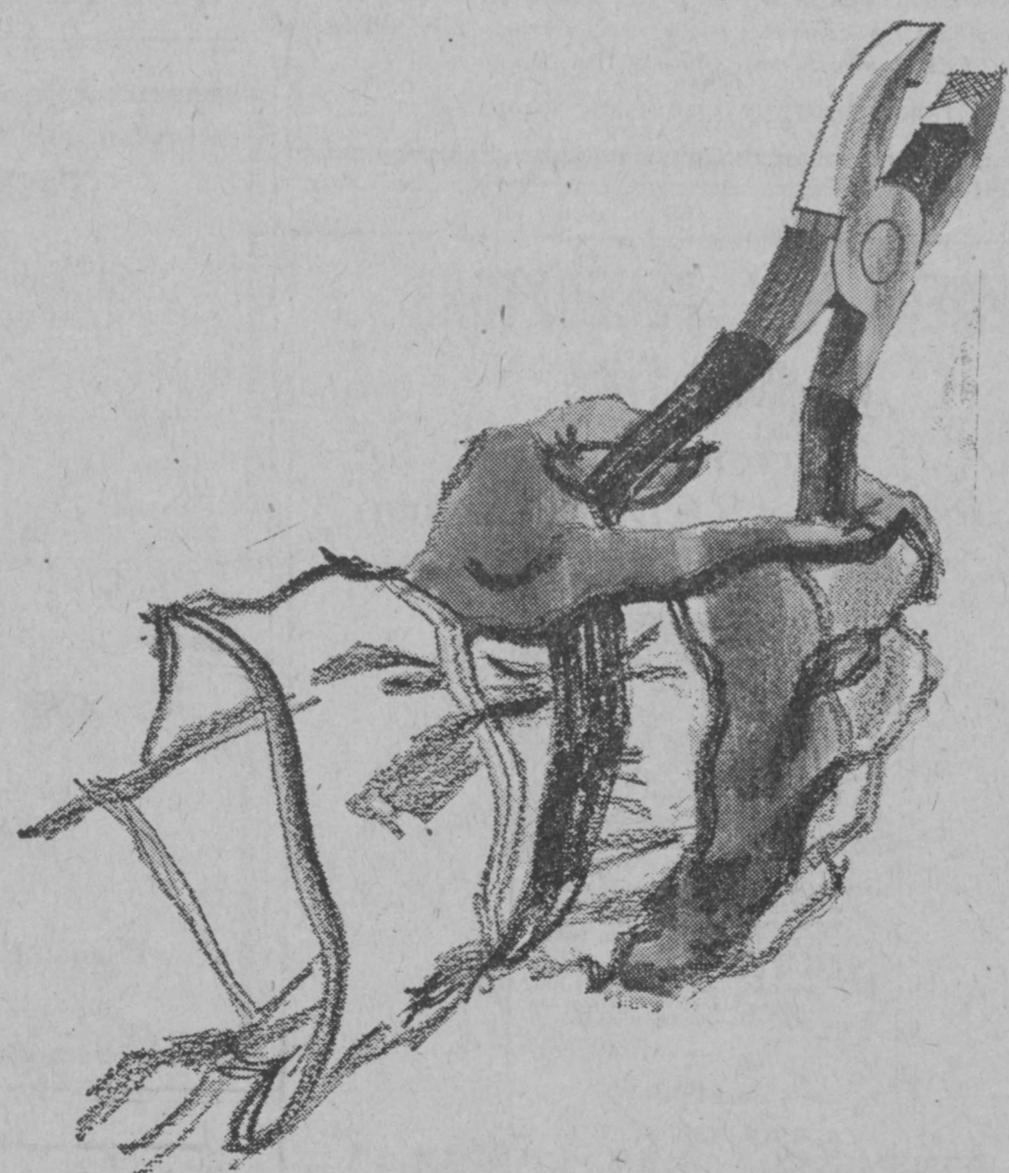
