15 KILLED IN A WRECK. Fifteen persons were killed and 5.0 injured on the Philadelphia and Reading Railroad last Sunday morning in a rear end collison between a southbound Atlantic City excursion train and a milk train.

The disaster occurred a few minntes before seven o'clock at Hatfield, Pa., a small station in Montgomery county, on the Bethlehem branch of the Philadelphia and Reading Railway, 27 miles northwest of Philadelphia. A dense fog prevailed at the time, the milk train was late and this system of the Reading is operated without block signals.

The Atlantic City excursion left Bethlehem in three sections a few minutes after six o'clock. Three quarters of an hour later the first section, composed of a locomotive and 10 cars, crowded with passengers, while running at a speed of between 40 and 50 miles an hour, crashed into the rear car of a train composed of four milk cars and a passenger coach, standing in front of the little station at Hatfield.

The momentum of the excursion train was so great that the train ahead of it was driven almost 300 feet. The black pigment which forms the base of the ink was the soot obtained by burning lac and pine charcoal. This soot was powdered finely and mixed with some kind of size or glue. Fish glue, or isinglass, was used as well as bone or horn glue, and sometimes, in making the finer qualities of ink, pearls were boiled in glue. Sometimes dried cx tongue was added to give the ink a purple tint, and the bark of the pepper tree was used to produce a tinge of blue. The ink was carefully molded, dried and packed in wormwood leaves with lime or ashes until well seasoned.

It is not stated whether sepia, the coloring liquid of the cuttlefish, was added to the ink originally or not; but, as the best india ink in use at present has a brownish tint, as if mixed with sepia, it is evident that sepia is used now in the manufacture of the ink. Sepia alone is used frequently in China in preference to the black ink.
