



WHY THE FARMER SUFFERS.

The industrial Commission has made public its review of evidence taken before the commission on the subjects of agriculture and agricultural labor.

The cause most often assigned for the depression of agriculture in the Eastern States is the increased production due to the opening of Western lands in advance of the natural demand.

The old staple products have thus become unprofitable in the East, it has been necessary for farmers to change their methods and vary the character of their crops.

Another cause which several witnesses assign for the unsatisfactory condition of agriculture in some parts of the country is the conservatism of the farmers.

The decline in the price of cotton is, of course, an important element in the depression of agriculture in the South.

The inefficiency of negro labor is assigned as another cause. On the other hand it is affirmed that there is too much good and cheap labor in the South.

Against the charge that farmers are unduly conservative is put the counter-charge that they turn from one crop to another without sufficient regard to the suitability of the climate and soil.

He told the President that next to Great Britain and Germany, the trade of Canada with the United States represented more in money to the manufacturers and producers of the United States than that of any other country.

The President received the delegation cordially. He said that he did not need to be reminded of the importance of a question to which he had given much thought and attention.

FOREST FIRES RAGING.

St. Louis, Nov. 12.—According to dispatches received here, forest fires are raging in the forest of Red Bud and Alto Pass, Ill., Poplar Bluff, Mo., and Sedgewick, Ark., North of Red Bud the woods along the Black creek bottoms are on fire and the farmers are fighting hard to save their homes.

Farm property in the vicinity of Alto Pass, Ill., is in great danger from forest fires which are raging in the timber west and south of town and a terrific gale is blowing.

Forest fires have broken out south of Poplar Bluff, Mo. The sky is covered with dense volumes of smoke and great damage to property is feared.

ZINC PLANT SWALLOWED UP.

JOPLIN, Mo., Nov. 13.—In a cave-in at Orongo, near this place, today the entire plant of the Aurora Mining Company, one of the greatest zinc producers in the district, was swallowed up. No lives were lost.

The plant comprised a 100-ton mill, office building and engine house, all of which were engulfed, together with six gravel cars and an immense "tailing" pile.

On entering the ground a short time before the cave-in occurred, workmen heard the timbers cracking and signaled to be drawn up. The last man had reached the surface only a few minutes before the timbers collapsed, the earth yielded and, with a crash, the whole plant sank into the abyss.

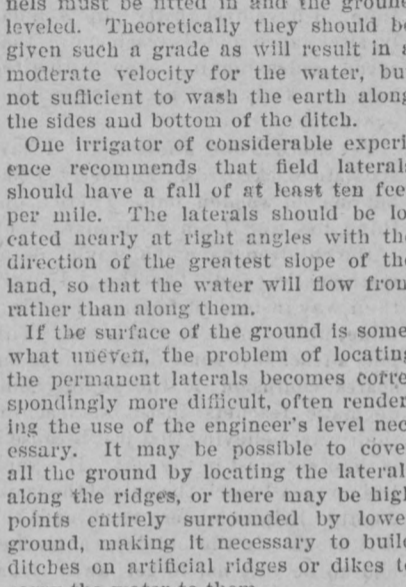


FARM AND GARDEN.

PRACTICAL IRRIGATION.

A Plan For a Forty Acre Farm-The Location of Laterals. Irrigation has become a live question in every part of the country, and many are on the lookout for practical information on its various points.

neils must be fitted in and the ground leveled. Theoretically they should be given such a grade as will result in a moderate velocity for the water, but not sufficient to wash the earth along the sides and bottom of the ditch.

The inexperienced irrigator often considers that the ground occupied by the laterals is waste land because it bears no crop. Accordingly he makes them far apart, so that the water must flow a long distance to cover the surface between any two.

It is usually pay to do some work in smoothing off the little irregularities in the surface of the farm. This may be done with a plank scraper or drag after the ground has been plowed.

Such an arrangement permits the water to flow away from rather than along the laterals. The main ditch divides at A, as shown in the diagram; one branch runs south to L, while a second runs west to D, the middle of the north line of the farm, where it turns and flows south to M.

Alfalfa is irrigated by the method known as flooding, which may be described as follows: Nearly parallel ditches, BC, EF, etc., are made 100 to 150 feet apart through the field. In the present case six ditches are made, 110 feet apart, dividing the field into six strips.

Modern Advertising.
