Travel they must but it does give one a sickening feeling when he or she stops and thinks just what could happen.

Rev. Harry J. Flynn, rector of Mt. St. Mary's Seminary, has filled two vacancies on his administrative staff by naming Rev. John Holley as vice rector and Rev. Lawrence A. Plutko as dean of men.

Fr. Holley, a native of New Hampshire, has been teaching American and Church History at the Mount since 1968. He has received history degrees from Washington & Lee (1946) and Stanford (1948), and he is presently doing post-graduate at Catholic University. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1960.



Fr. Plutko, who was raised in McKeesport, Pa., is a 1967 graduate of Mt. St. Mary's College and a 1970 graduate of the Seminary. He has also done graduate work at Johns Hopkins and Harvard. He is currently an instructor of Graduate Theology in the Seminary.

Fr. Holley's new duties involve serving as one of Fr. Flynn's chief assistants and acting as rector in his absence. Fr. Plutko will be responsible for maintaining good relations between the students and the faculty and administration.

College Student Charged With Hit-Run

A Mount Saint Mary's College senior will face a charge laid by Gettysburg police for a traffic code violation as a result of a \$2,300 hit-and-run collision involving his car and three others in the 300 block of N. Washington St., Gettysburg, at 9:10 o'clock Saturday evening.

Gettysburg police said Brian Anthony Peirano, Arlington, Va., will be charged with failing to reveal his identity at the scene of an accident.

According to Gettysburg police, W. Henry Filler, Emmitsburg Police Chief, informed them at 1:30 p.m. Monday that he found a damaged 1966 blue Ford that matched the description of the hit and run auto. Aided by Filler, Gettysburg police concluded that the damaged auto left at Dudash's service station, south of Emmitsburg, was the hit and run vehicle. After questioning Peirano, the owner of the car, they decided to prefer the charge against him. It will be filed before Justice of the Peace Charles R. Leader.

Police said the accident resulted in \$500 damage to Peirano's auto; \$700 to a car owned by Mrs. Helen Mulhern of Ventnor, Mich.; \$600 to the auto of Paul Marsden, Gettysburg R6, and \$500 to the auto of Louise E. and Oliver King, 315 S. Washington St., Gettysburg. The three cars were parked on S. Washington St. when they were damaged.

Lutheran Woman To Be Ordained; First In America



Miss Elizabeth Alvina Platz will be the first Lutheran woman to be ordained in this country. This historic event will take place Sunday, Nov. 22, at 4:30 p. m., in the Chapel of the University of Maryland, College Park, Md.

Miss Platz has been a Lutheran Campus Worker at the University of Maryland since 1965. She was graduated from the Lutheran Theological Seminary, Gettysburg with her Bachelor of Divinity degree conferred in 1965. The Maryland Synod in convention October 24, authorized her ordination. The executive board of Maryland Synod has extended her a call to special services, as a campus minister at the University of Maryland campus, College Park.

She was born August 29, 1940, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Victor Platz of Pittsburgh. She was graduated from Carrick High School and Chatham College in Pittsburgh and from the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Gettysburg, Pa.

The ordination of women, although new in North America, has been authorized for some time by many Lutheran churches in Europe. The public is invited to attend.

Churches To Sponsor Thanksgiving Service Here

The annual Community Thanksgiving Service in Emmitsburg will be held at Elias Lutheran Church, Thursday, November 26, beginning at 10 a.m. For the first time in this community's long history, both Catholics and Protestants will celebrate the spiritual observance of this national holiday together.

In the past, the five local Protestant Churches took turns in hosting this community service. This year, as a natural outgrowth of the ecumenical movement of this century, and particularly of recent years, all Churches of the Emmitsburg Parish will have the opportunity to worship together on Thanksgiving morning. Prior ecumenical services have been limited to the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which comes each year in January. The last such service was at St. Joseph's Church on Sunday, January 25, 1970.

Father John King, of St. Joseph's, will preach the Thanksgiving sermon and Pastor Ronald Fearer, of the host congregation, will serve as Liturgist. A Liturgy of the host congregation will be used. The adult choir will sing "I Will Always Give Thanks", and the children's choir will sing "One God." The choir director is Miss Penny Hallet and the organist is Mrs. Donald Eyer.

The offering will be given to the Emmitsburg Community Fund, which ministers to the emergency needs of families within the Parish, as well as transient families. Everyone in the local congregations is cordially invited to attend and participate.




