

The new regulations which became effective Dec. 1, 1971, require that day care staff who are deficient in training must upgrade their qualifications within a three year period.

Commenting on the new regulations, Dr. Neil Solomon, Maryland Health and Mental Hygiene secretary, said he is concerned not only with conditions of safety and sanitation in day care centers, but also with the type of persons who teach and supervise the children. He feels that the competence of day care personnel to oversee the growth and development of children when they are away utmost importance".
