in all Russian history. It was a forced resettlement of a whole people, an ethnic catastrophe... Then the Kirov wave from Leningrad was purged—cleaned out." (Note: all these innocent people were sent to the labor camps, most died within 10 years.)

so fantastic about that? It is even an understatement! According to other rumors 1,700,000 persons were shot by January 1, 1939 (not counting the millions more sentenced to slave labor camps...)

Well, that is the equivalent of a small country, Sweden or Greece." And so Solzhenitsyn writes his documented expose, giving the details year after year after year, and emphasizing in all his public statements that the enemy is Communism, documenting its evil nature, its designs on all the world, and warning the world not to accept its bogus postures and dramatic claims for wanting "peace." It is, he says, the "peace" in which human beings are being systematically disintegrated.



Communist Torture, Torment, Terror  
Before first publication of the dramatic smuggled-out-of-Russia book, "Gulag Archipelago" its Nobel prize-winning author, Alexander I. Solzhenitsyn, slave labor camp pris-

oner for 8 years, and the intellectual "dissident" who has given Communist bosses, from Stalin to Brezhnev, the most trouble for the past 20 years, made a lengthy statement to the people of the world. In it, Solzhenitsyn empha-

sized that "torture, torment, and terror" on an unparalleled scale continues in the Soviet Union. He warned that the "terror" police system, to which he devotes many of the pages in his book, remains intact and that especially Russian writers, poets, philosophers, mathematicians and others are being subjected today to forced labor, the tortures of interrogation and all the horrors that the system first created in 1918.

Here are excerpts from the book, as translated into English in a copyright series by the New York Times:  
"This book could never have been created by one single person alone. It contains, in addition to what I myself was able to take away from the archipelago (the spreading mass of Russians and foreigners who have suffered the torture of the labor camps as he himself did for eight years) on the skin of my back and in my mind's eye—the material in stories, memoirs, and letters of 227 human beings (who learned clandestinely he was working on the book)."

"During the arrest of Inoshin, a locomotive engineer, there stood in his room a coffin containing the body of his child who had just died. The 'law officers' threw the child's body out of the coffin and searched it. They shake sick people out of their sickbeds and they unwind bandages to search beneath them (for evidence of dissent)... Maybe only after half a year or a year does the arrested person respond at all or else they (KGB) toss out: 'Deprived of the right to correspond.' That means: once and for all. 'Deprived of the right to correspond'—and indicates almost without fail: 'Has been shot.'"

"Committee of the Poor"  
"In thinking about the period from 1918 to 1920 we are in difficulties: Should we classify among the waves of prisoners all those done in before they even got to the cells? And in what classification should those be put whom the 'Committees of the Poor' (KGB front) took off behind the wing of the village soviet or in the rear of a courtyard and finished off there?"  
"The waves foamed and rolled—but across all of them there billowed, and gushed in 1929-30 the multimillion wave of 'dispossessed Kulaks' (farmers who resisted collectivization). It was immeasurably large and it went straight to the transit prisons and points, onto prisoner transports, into the Gulag (prison camp) country. There was nothing to be compared with

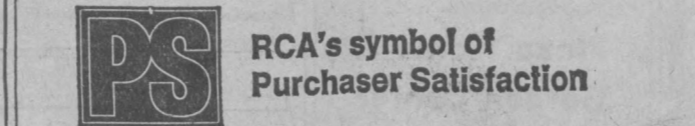

# BUSINESS AND THE STOCK MARKET

**Time To Re-Check Your Will**

Wellesley Hills, Mass., April 18, 1974 — We have always maintained—and have so indicated on many occasions over the years—that everyone who has come of age should make a will. Those who have not done so should do so immediately—this week if possible—since one never knows what the future may hold.

After having advised so many times on the importance of making a will, we are going to assume for the purpose of this article that most of you have one filed away in a safe deposit box. That is fine. But, when was it last examined? Are you certain that it is still appropriate for circumstances as they now exist?

We bring up this matter because there are many things that might have happened since you made out your will—things that could invalidate parts of it, cause delay and disappointment or unnecessary additional expense, or perhaps even mean a loss to your heirs. Therefore, we believe it is essential that you periodically check over your will, changing it and updating it whenever necessary. This should always be done under the guidance of a competent attorney, who might discover some technical correction which should be made in your will as it now stands. Don't, however, allow your attorney to talk you into making a new instrument without your first consulting with other authorities.

Some Checkpoints  
When looking over your will, here are a few of the more important things you should look for. Do you have newly acquired property or other assets that have increased substantially in value, thereby necessitating some alterations in your will? For example, if you are the owner of or have an interest in a corporation which has grown tremendously since you made out your will, there may be need of special tax treatment as the hold could now represent a substantial portion of your estate. Or perhaps there has been a shift in the type of assets you hold which may demand a change in a bequest from, says, stocks to real estate.

Do you still own the assets bequeathed or have they changed in any way? Here it would be important to check stock splits, for instance. If you

leave 100 shares of a certain stock to a child or grandchild, it is just possible that there has been a split in the issue in the meantime. Do you still intend the child to get only 100 shares?  
Have you moved to another state since you made out your will? If so, you should check on the inheritance laws of your new home state to see if there are possible differences in interpretation of certain provisions. However, even if you have not moved to another state, the laws of your home state are subject to frequent change, particularly in regard to trusts, treatment of life insurance payoffs, etc.

**Forgotten Differences**  
Do you have any bequests that are no longer applicable? For example, are you sure that the fellow hobbyist to whom you have willed your valuable collection is still actively interested in that hobby? Are there any new children or grandchildren for whom you have neglected to make provision? It seems unthinkable that such an oversight could occur, but it has been known to happen. Check your will to make sure.

Does your will give recognition to the spiraling inflation. In other words, do you feel that the sum of money you have left to a particular person is as adequate or generous now as you believed it was when you originally made your will?  
Are your witnesses still available? When a will is probated, it can often save a great deal of time and money if witnesses are readily available to testify.

The foregoing are just a few of the items that deserve serious consideration when you re-read and review your will. Naturally, if any doubts persist regarding the document in its present form, you should consult with your attorney at the earliest possible opportunity.

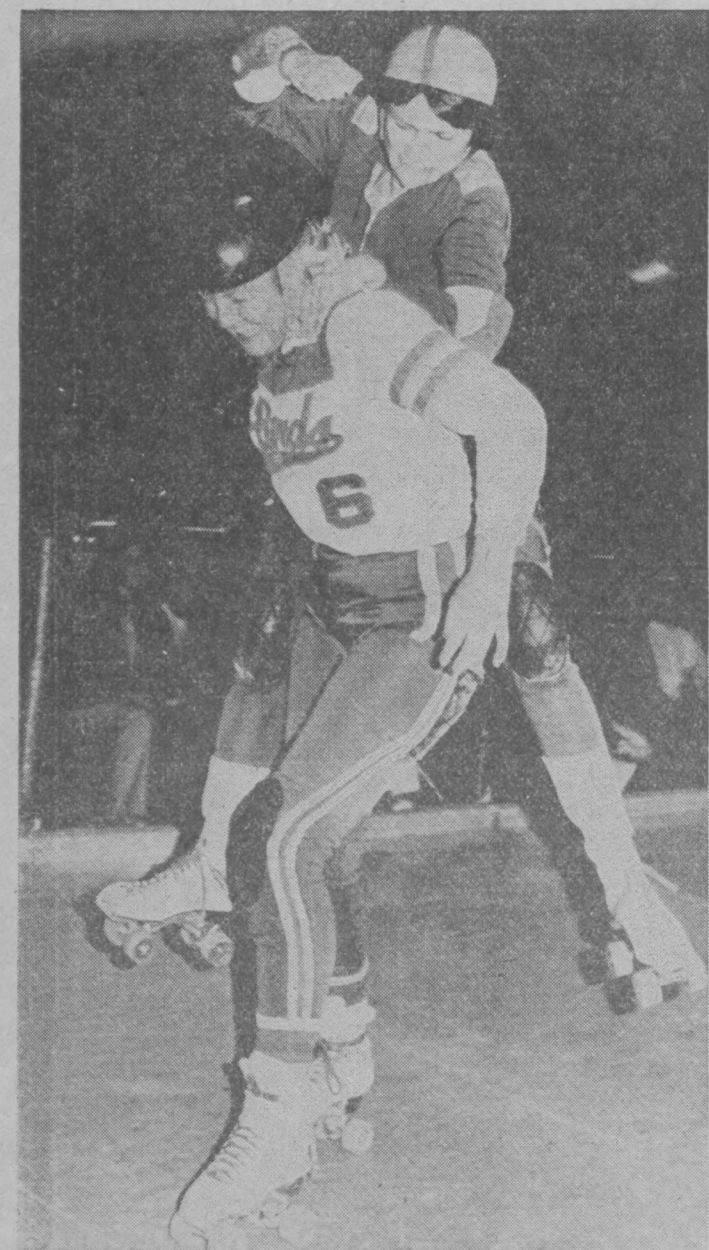

Safety Council Lists Precautions

Falls rank second only to motor vehicles as a cause of accidental death. Through more fatal falls happen at home than at work, most often to older persons out of the work force.

Falls cause about one in four farm work injuries, according to National Safety Council data. Most of these falls occurred while working with farm machinery, loading and unloading, on ladders, and around buildings.

According to farm accident surveys, more falls were connected with the use of farm machinery than from any other farm work operation.

Youth Eligible For Conservation Corps

Youth from Frederick County will be eligible to participate in Youth Conservation Programs this summer, according to spokesmen at the Board of Education of Frederick County.

Public school students, out-of-school youths, and non-public school students between the ages of 15 and 18 are eligible. Guidance counselors in the schools are distributing materials and application forms.

The Youth Conservation Corps, is a program funded and operated by the U. S. Department of the Interior and the U. S. Agriculture-Forest Service, and coordinated by the Maryland State Department of Education in Maryland.

Mathias Campaign Chairman Picked

Dr. Milton S. Eisenhower, president emeritus of the Johns Hopkins University, will serve as honorary chairman of Marylanders for Mathias, the single central organization which will administer the re-election campaign of Senator Charles McC. Mathias (R.) of Maryland.

In announcing the appointment of his old friend to the campaign post, Senator Mathias said, "The long and distinguished record of Milton Eisenhower's service to Maryland and the nation has already assured him a place on any roll of outstanding Marylanders."

In accepting the honorary chairmanship of Marylanders for Mathias, Dr. Eisenhower said, "Mac Mathias has brought honor to the state of Maryland. It is typical of his efforts to raise the level of public service that even his re-election campaign is dedicated to that goal, through the adoption of unprecedented reforms."

The creation of Marylanders for Mathias as a single central campaign organization was one of a number of reforms announced by Senator Mathias last December 21. Others include the acceptance of contributions by check only, no contributions of more than \$100 from any individual.

Mathias first elected to the Senate in 1968, will be seeking re-election for the first time. He was in the House of Representatives from 1960 to 1968.

Beware Of Berries

A total of 461 emergency calls concerning children under age 11 swallowing plants, berries, tree bark and shrubs were received by the Poison Control Center last year, about 100 more than 1972.

Dr. Solomon said preschoolers who are unable to read articles on fatal and non-fatal plants, or fully understand TV commercials, cannot evaluate the possible poison contents of attractive leaves and berries that grow in their neighborhood.

Even though Spring is just beginning, over 50 cases of ingestion of poisonous seeds, berries and plants have been called in for emergency information, the Secretary noted, to the Preventive Medicine Administration's Poison Control Center.

Since most adults and children under eight years of age will find it difficult to differentiate between poisonous and non-poisonous berries and leaves, lists of such dangerous plant life are available from the Poison Control Center, 636 West Lombard Street, Baltimore, Md. 21201, Dr. Solomon advised.

Older people with fixed incomes have a hard time making ends meet. They tend to skip a meal here and there, trying to save a few dollars. What they forget is that by establishing poor nutrition habits, they risk lowering their physical stamina and perhaps incurring medical expenses at a time when they can least afford it.



To prove that it can be done, here's a menu that will feed two people living on fixed incomes both wisely and well. Recipes are included. Please note that the total grocery bill for the day is well under five dollars, leaving extra money for treats or for a rainy day.
