## Farewell To The 10c Phone Call

New intrastate rate schedules which C&P Telephone asked the Maryland Public Service Commission this week to approve will mean the first general increase in rates for basic local telephone service in Maryland in three years.

The tariffs would yield a 14.8 per cent increase in gross annual intrastate revenues.

The amount of the increase in basic monthly charges for Emmitsburg customers will be \$2.00 for individual line residence service, and \$4.90 for a main business line.

Public telephone which have been 10 cents in Maryland for 22 years, will be 20 cents.

C&P Vice President James J. Jacobs said, 'We've worked basic telephone service, very few things cost the same as they did three years ago.

"There is one reason, and only one, why telephone rates have to go up now, and that's inflation—the same reason everything else costs more. Our costs fir providing your tele-phone service are climbing almost daily.

"Much of our expense is brought about by the high degree of mobility in our state. For every telephone we gain, we have to install or disconnect more than nine phones. And while growth has slowed somewhat, we still have con-
