

Byron To Oppose Fed. Land Use Bill

trusion into local affairs", the schools, Rep. Goodloe Byron (Md.-6) has indicated he will oppose the Federal land use bill currently before the Interior Food 'N Friends Committee of Congress.

As a member of the House Menu, May 13 & 15 Interior Committee, he also feels the bill may retard the search for new energy sourc-

Byron, former Chairman of Tuesday, May 13 the Maryland Planning & Zonng Law Study Commission, believes the way to better land use planning lies in localities and states making the land use decisions rather than the federal government.

"Community growth requirements and questions on how an owner can use his land are often sensitive and complex matters that are best settled at the local level," Byron

Referring to the "higher priority' of cutting federal spending Byron sees the \$500 million land use proposal as only adding to the federal deficit and resulting inflationary oressures.

"In these economic times Congress can only afford to approve high priority programs, of which this is not one.

"We must eliminate further bureaucratic entanglements and reexamine our apparent philosophy that the federal government should fulfill all cost, Byron concluded.





many years. Cost Of Mining In Deep Sea Very Costly

The American companies which have already spent about one hundred million dollars to develop the technology for profitable mining of the resources of the sea-bed, know it will be extremely costly to make these metals available for industry. They are not asking to be insured against unprofitability, only that the government assure them against expropriation or takeover. The risk would be too great without these assurances, and Congress seems to be in the mood to go ahead and pass the Act. However, there are some who are objecting and the State Department is one of the objectors.

The Philosophy Involved Some objectors seem to fear that if the U.S. goes ahead, that free enterprise will have an advantage. That is precisely why we should go ahead and stop waiting on the endless bickering in the UN. More of the people of the world will be benefited by these minerals and metals if they are minded by free-enterprise than if they are owned by the UN. That is the way it has always been





In some respects, DIF is whether applicants for charge accounts are good credit risks. As many as 15 to 20 items on a return may be cross-checked, resulting in a thousand or more comparisons, all done with the lightning speed of omputers.

To keep DIF accurate and up-to-date, the IRS regularly conducts in-depth audits of randomly selected tax returns filed across the country. When results of the audits show the need, new formulas are developed and DIF is modified accordingly.

Returns scored high by DIF are sent to experienced IRS employees called "screeners' to determine whether or not local conditions or other fact-




